World Mission Sunday

Since his election to the papacy in 2013, Pope Francis has been driven by a dream – the dream of the Church becoming a truly *missionary* Church. Writing in 2022, he said 'Dear brothers and sisters, I continue to dream of a completely missionary Church, and a new era of missionary activity among Christian communities'. The current Synod of Bishops taking place in Rome is an attempt by Francis to realize this dream – that as Church we become true **missionary disciples** of Jesus.

For Francis, every member of the Church has a shared responsibility to witness to Christ, to invite all to share in the riches of Christ's message and the hope it offers. He often refers to Pope Paul Vis document of 1975, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, which sought to give a new momentum to evangelisation. As 'a document dear to my heart,' he cited its much-quoted line: 'Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses'. He wrote'In evangelisation, then, the example of a Christian life and the proclamation of Christ are inseparable. One is at the service of the other. They are the two lungs with which any community must breathe, if it is to be missionary...This kind of complete, consistent, and joyful witness to Christ will surely be a force of attraction also for the growth of the Church in the third millennium. The Church must constantly keep pressing forward, beyond her own confines, in order to testify to all the love of Christ'.

In recent months, a burning issue here in Ireland is immigration. Our bishops have issued a Pastoral Letter on this topic (available in the church). Francis speaks to us about the importance and role of migrants in the task of evangelization. Again, referring to Paul VI, 'More and more, we are seeing how the presence of faithful of various nationalities enriches the face of our communities and makes them more universal, more Catholic. Consequently, the pastoral care of migrants should be valued as an important missionary activity that can also help the local faithful to rediscover the joy of the Christian faith they have received'.
